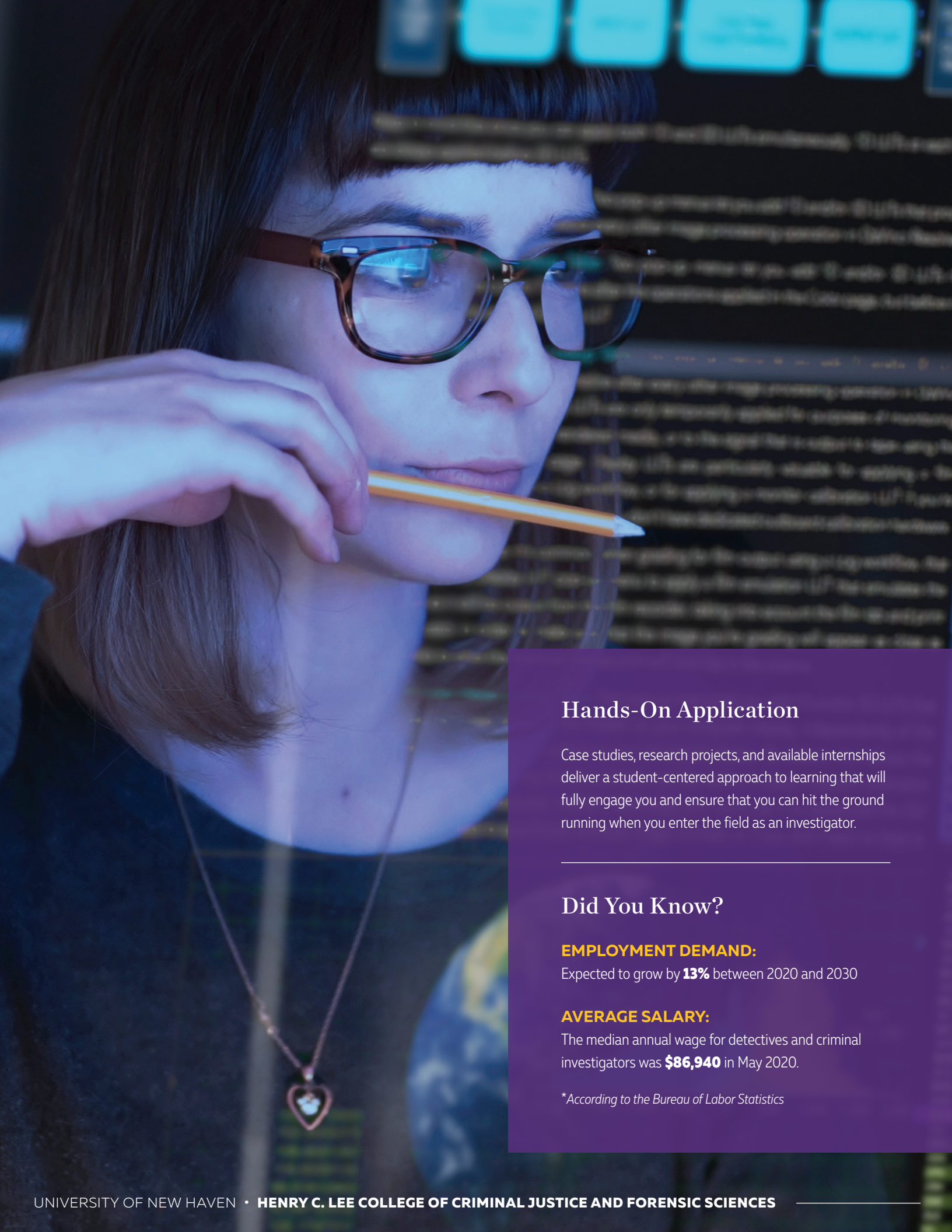
Program Description

Whether you are looking to enter the public law enforcement sector or bring your knowledge and skills to the private sector, the M.S. in Investigations can be customized to fit your needs.

Housed within the Henry C. Lee College of Criminal Justice and Forensic Sciences, this program brings together esteemed faculty from our forensic science, criminal justice, and investigations programs. Thirty graduate credits are required for the degree, which combines courses in criminal justice, forensic science, investigations, and legal studies to provide a comprehensive education in the highly specialized area of investigations.

Choose your Concentration

The option to choose a program concentration provides greater flexibility for students. The three concentrations are:

- **Criminal Investigations Concentration:** designed to allow students to network with professionals, explore career options, and focus studies in death investigations, cold case investigations, international crime, Title IX, civil rights investigations, financial crime, cybercrime, and digital forensic investigations. *Those seeking additional expertise in Crime Scene Investigation should consider the Forensic Technology M.S. program.*
- **Financial Crimes Investigations Concentration:** designed to provide students with the knowledge to prepare them for the following certification exams: IAFCI Certified Financial Crimes Investigator (CFCI), Association of Certified Anti-Money Laundering Specialists (ACAMS-educational partner), ACFCs Certified Financial Crimes Specialist (CFCS), AICPA's Certified in Financial Forensics (CFF), ACFE Certified Fraud Examiner (CFE), and other national and international certifications.

Related Degree Programs

- **M.S. in Healthcare Fraud, Waste, & Abuse (FWA) Investigations:** provides students with background knowledge of and requisite insight into one of the fastest-growing areas of white-collar investigations. Students will gain an awareness and in-depth understanding of healthcare FWA from a variety of perspectives, including those of frontline investigators and analysts who have worked the broad types of schemes perpetuated by those intent on stealing the precious healthcare dollars that we all need.
- **M.S. in Digital Forensic Investigations:** provides students with fundamental and advanced knowledge of the evolving field of digital forensics. Students will gain insight and in-depth understanding of key concepts in investigations, including those used by investigators in the field and in the laboratory, addressing digital-based evidence. Students will learn and understand the unique techniques and forensic tools used in performing investigations, with specific focus on investigations involving digital devices and a wide array of sources of data that may be encountered today.

Time to Completion

- 12 months (3 semesters), 18 months (4 semesters), or 24 months (6 semesters)
- The average time to degree completion is 18 months. All core courses are offered each term.
- Special topics, electives, and focused areas of study are offered based on demand.
